

I have been on the WFSA Education Committee since 2016. I have contributed by working on the current monitoring and evaluation process for the WFSA fellowships, and am working on a research project to formally evaluate all WFSA fellowships. I have also co-developed the Inspire Through Clinical Teaching and Inspire Through Clinical Leadership courses, in collaboration with the WFSA. These courses (see <https://inspirecourse.com/>) have been taught in Rwanda, Zambia, Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Guyana and Canada. I am also working towards establishing a new pediatric anesthesia fellowship in Capetown, supported by the Canadian Pediatric Anesthesia Society and others, which we hope will be part of the WFSA fellowship portfolio.

I bring a breadth of clinical, educational and research experience, having lived and worked in four continents. I was involved in the development of the University of Zambia anesthesia residency program and as the chair of <https://casief.ca/> have been working with similar partnerships in Ethiopia, Rwanda, Guyana and Burkina Faso.
