

Curriculum Vitae: David Pescod, Clinical Associate Professor University of Melbourne

Since graduation as a Fellow of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (FANZCA) in 1996, I have had significant and sustained involvement in evaluated teaching at an undergraduate, postgraduate and professional level both locally, nationally and internationally, making original and innovative contributions to the advancement of anaesthesia, which has attained recognition at a national and international level with awards in 2011 from the Australian Society of Anaesthetists with the President's Award and the Mongolian Medal of Honour from the Mongolian Government, awarded in appreciation of my "contribution and dedication for the protection and promotion of health and wellbeing for the people of Mongolia".

As a component of continuing education I have created intellectual property including an anaesthetic textbook for low to middle income countries (LMICs), peer reviewed publications, anaesthesia websites and assisted Mongolia with developing their anaesthetic training program. I have presented papers at national and international meetings and seminars and since 1998, as an ANZCA supervisor of training, I have overseen the progression of anaesthetic registrars and general practitioners with their anaesthesia training.

I have had continued leadership/committee roles within the Northern Hospital, and significant roles in professional bodies, advocating the availability and safety of anaesthesia. Nationally, since 2003, with the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA) Victorian Regional Committee and Overseas Aid Committee, the Australian Society of Anaesthetists (ASA) Overseas and Education Committees and internationally, since 2008 with the World Federation Society of Anaesthetists Publication Committee. Within the medical community I have professional roles in fostering sustainable surgical health systems in LMICs through ANZCA, ASA and Interplast Australia.

My participation with anaesthesia, throughout the Asia-Pacific region, includes in excess of 35 missions involving 10 different countries where I have delivered anaesthesia, educated anaesthesia providers, assisted anaesthesia societies and have been a facilitator, presenter and instructor on the Real World Anaesthesia Courses (RWAC), Primary Trauma Course (PTC), Essential Pain Management (EPM) courses, Emergencies in Anaesthesia (EIA) courses and with Lifebox.
